

## **Airport travel from Audlem.**

### **Manchester Airport.**

The most easily accessed airport from Audlem by public transport is Manchester airport, with only 2 changes, most of the journey by train, and a journey time between 1.5 and 2.5 hours. Generally journeys are achieved by taking the No.73 bus to Nantwich rail station, and from there by train towards Manchester, with one further train change frequently at Wilmslow, but occasionally at Crewe. Manchester airport has an integral rail station so no further changes are required.

### **Liverpool John Lennon Airport**

This journey involves 3 changes, but can still be achieved in 2–3 hours. The route is by travel to Crewe station (see guidance notes), and train to Liverpool, and bus to the airport. There is no train station at the airport.

### **Birmingham Airport**

Three changes are normally involved, and the typical journey time is 3 hours. The normal route is by travel to Crewe station (see guidance notes), and onward travel by train with one further train change. There is one service via Whitchurch on Mondays – Fridays involving only one change. This involves taking the 09.31 No.73 service to Whitchurch rail station and continuing by train directly to Birmingham. Journey time is approximately 2.5 hours. Return services to Audlem via Whitchurch normally involve longer journey times than the options via Crewe. Birmingham International station is within the airport complex, although a shuttle bus journey is necessary to arrive at the terminal.

### **East Midlands Airport**

Three changes are required, and the journey time is 3.5 – 4 hours. Travel to Crewe by the means explained in the guidance notes, and then onward by train to Derby and bus to the airport.

**London Airports**

Accessible via rail from Crewe, changing in London with journey times of 4 – 5 hours.

**Return journeys to Audlem**

In all cases the return journeys involve the reverse of the outward journey from Audlem, unless referred to specifically above.
